



Grant Funding During FY24

Van Buren County Hospital was fortunate to receive some additional grants and funds in FY24 to help support healthcare access in our

community. A federal HRSA Network Planning Grant allowed us to partner with several other area organizations and lay the groundwork for the Southeast Iowa Complex Care Network. A state of Iowa Center of Excellence grant then enabled us to start implementing this work. The VBCH portion of the Complex Care program will officially open on July 1, 2024.

Another grant that the hospital was able to secure was the Iowa United First Aid Grant. This was a pilot project in 3 rural communities in Iowa. The goal was to place volunteers throughout the county who were trained and equipped to be the first on the scene of an emergency. This grant funded the training, the Go-bags and the technology needed to implement this program in Van Buren County. The Van Buren County Supervisors and the Emergency Management team were both key players in this process and we want to thank the Supervisors for their financial match for the project. Van Buren County had 14 initial volunteers trained to respond to calls. They hope to expand this to additional volunteers in coming years. What is Iowa United First Aid?

If you call for emergency medical assistance in Van Buren County, one of the first people to arrive may be a local volunteer.

Why Volunteer?

Iowa United First Aid was started to coordinate volunteer response while waiting for EMS services. In some medical emergencies seconds matter, you could save the life of a family member, neighbor, or friend by signing up to volunteer in your community. Volunteers are only dispatched to emergencies taking place in close proximity to their location and can choose to respond as they are able.

Currently there are 16 trained volunteers in Van Buren County, we plan to add an additional 14 volunteers in 2024-25.

Federal grant allows for technology upgrades in FY24



VBCH was very fortunate to receive \$1.8 million dollars to upgrade equipment and technology through the federal Community Project Funding program. To qualify for this award, an organization must meet all eligibility criteria for a competitive federal award, as well as have support from a member of Congress. VBCH is very grateful to Representative Mariannette Miller-Meeks for choosing to sponsor our award. Representative Miller-Meeks was able to join members of our staff and Board of Trustees to see what a difference this award is making for patients in Van Buren County.

With the grant dollars, VBCH was able to purchase a new CT machine, a new mammography machine, a new X-Ray room, a new Lab Analyzer and several new servers and IT security components that will strengthen security around hospital and patient records. These amazing additions are allowing us to provide state of the art diagnostic images right here in Van Buren County. If you see Representative Miller-Meeks, please join us in thanking her and letting her know how important this funding is to ensure our rural residents have access to the highest quality care close to home.

Small daily improvements over time will create stunning results.




Financial Report FY24













A note from the VBCH CFO-

VBCH had another great year of growth with revenue increasing by 20%. Expenses also grew at a high rate at 14% as did all expenses in all sectors of the economy. VBCH was able to offset that with operating revenue, Medicaid direct payments, property taxes, noncapital grants and contributions, and investment income.

VBCH's biggest asset are the patients and staff and we can't thank them enough for all of their amazing work and support in 2024.
